Reduce child trauma

Increase number of children remaining safely in the home or placed with kin

MHAIS

Statewide consistency when making child safety decisions

Comprehensive ongoing Safety assessments across the continuum of service delivery

Strengthened engagement with parents and families

HOMs

impending danger threats

to control the danger

protective capacities to support lasting change

MHOs

Child welfare workforce are implementing the practice model

Parents are more actively participating in plans for their child's safety

Partner agencies are experiencing a shift in how services are provided to children and families

Safety Plan Determination

Is there a home?

Is it calm and consistent enough? Are they willing and able to participate?

Are there sufficient resources available to control the danger?





All 4 are YES

Child can remain in the home with necessary supports in place







Any of the 4 are NO

Child safety not assured, so removal is necessary
